Netflix has produced a television series based on Jay Asher's 2007 bestselling novel entitled, "Thirteen Reasons Why." The topics covered in this book are: adolescent bullying, rejection, heartbreak, sexual assault, abuse, revenge, depression, desperate but unsuccessful efforts to find help or understanding and suicide. Series like this can be difficult to watch and could trigger feelings of distress in viewers.

We expect this new series to be popular with teenage viewers. In the event your student chooses to view this series, you may wish to discuss some of the issues mentioned above or may need support in discussing such issues. Although Netflix opened all 13 episodes for continuous viewing, metered viewing is advised to allow time to process and discuss themes and feelings that may arise.

Please note that this is not recommending viewing this series; it is intended to provide you with information we feel is relevant to the health and wellbeing of our students and families.
