## **OUR COMMUNITY**

Located 35 miles south of San Francisco and 14 miles north of San Jose in Santa Clara County, Palo Alto is a community of approximately 61,200 residents. Palo Alto is also the home of Stanford University and an excellent community college, Foothill College. The high tech industry that is at the heart of the Bay Area's Silicon Valley has its roots in Palo Alto. A large percentage of city residents are professionals in the high tech industry, education, healthcare, retail, and service industries.

#### **OUR STUDENTS**

The student body reflects the demographics of the ethnically diverse and socio-economically prosperous city of Palo Alto. Gunn embraces its diversity and seeks to foster ways of further diversifying the student body. It is an open and accepting learning community where all students, regardless of background or socio-economic status, feel safe, cared for, and supported in order for them to receive an outstanding education that prepares them for college or career.

Gunn, one of two public high schools in Palo Alto, is a 4-year high school with an enrollment of just over 1885 students. The ethnic/racial make up of our student population is 2% African-American, 8.5% Hispanic, 40% Asian, 39% Caucasian, and 3% two-or-more races. Roughly 5% of our students are classified as limited English proficient.


